Growing up in Charleston, South Carolina, I have been surrounded my entire life by Lowcountry landscapes like marsh grass, Spanish moss, and architecture steeped in hundreds of years of history. Ironwork is an integral element in many of the historical homes here, and I've always admired our celebrated blacksmiths like Philip Simmons for carrying on the design traditions of this beautiful city. I definitely draw inspiration for my designs from my surroundings, and enjoy working with clients who have a connection to the natural elements of the Lowcountry, like cattails, grasses, and palm fronds, and want these things worked into their designs.

I derive so much of my creative energy from organic landscapes of all kinds, not just in the Lowcountry. I get ideas and inspiration by considering the texture, growth, and movement of all life forms and nature, like how the wind moves through the grass, the ebb and flow of the ocean, and the balance of rolling hills.


Lighting designed for the Hilton Resort on Hilton Head Island, South Carolina. The lights have an acrylic defuser.

I forged this piece on a much smaller scale at the end of 2009.
